## AFGHANISTAN

### Inclusive Livelihoods for Persons with Disabilities in Kabul



This project takes a holistic approach to integrating mine survivors and other people with disabilities into mainstream economic activity. It focuses on basic education services, community-based vocational training, job placement support and micro-credit programs for mine survivors and people with disabilities. The main objective is the rehabilitation of people with disabilities in order to assist them to integrate into the wider community by implementing appropriate training and finding relevant job opportunities that will equip them with the skills needed to live an independent life. The trainings are community-based and are carried out in various parts of Kabul city in different vocational institutions. The trainees will receive training based on their own expressed needs and wishes.

## BANGLADESH

### Program for Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh



A durable solution has yet to be found for stateless Rohingya people from Northern Rakhine state in Burma who fled to southern Bangladesh in 1991 to escape racial and religious discrimination by the Burmese government. Recent reports indicate that refugees remain dependent on humanitarian assistance and an end to assistance will only be possible when refugees are provided with opportunities for self reliance. This program will contribute to long-term durable solutions for the Rohingya population in Cox's Bazaar. Activities include education (including primary education), vocational training, and improving sanitation and nutrition. These activities will increase the levels of skills and confidence of the Rohingya community both inside and outside the camps and thereby increase the opportunity for their integration in the broader community over the long term.

## Integrated Mine Action and Development Program in Banteay Meanchey Province



This 5-year integrated mine action program will address landmine contamination in the context of community development. It targets poor communities in remote areas close to the heavily mined K5 belt in western Banteay Meanchey (BMC) Province. Consultation with communities in this Province has exposed the limited livelihood opportunities facing rural mine-affected communities, with many villagers forced to seek alternative sources of food and income, by crossing into Thailand for seasonal work or foraging in the heavily mined forest nearby.

Austcare is addressing the landmine problem as a development problem. It integrates mine clearance with other development activities in partnership with the Cambodian Mine Action Centre (CMAC), the indigenous demining operator. Agricultural land is being prioritised for clearance in order to increase livelihood opportunities and Austcare is supporting the Mine Action Planning Unit (MAPU) process to ensure transparent prioritisation of land for clearance. The program aims to improve the socio-economic conditions of mine-affected communities through the provision of water for domestic and agricultural use; the provision of agricultural training and inputs; and the provision of skills training for vulnerable groups, particularly landmine survivors, other people with disabilities and women. The underlying approach of this innovative program is to strengthen governance through partnerships with the Commune Councils ensuring support to the Commune Investment Planning process and building sustainability of this local government structure and its processes.

## Model Farms and Community Rice Banks in Otdar Meanchey (OMC) Province



This project implements model farms and community rice seed banks in mine-affected communities in OMC Province. The project builds on Austcare's previous successes in community based farming systems in this Province. The final outcomes of this project will include 50 operational model farms and 10 rice seed banks with functional management committees, implemented over a two year period. This will result in improved food security, and an increased ability of families of selected farmers to meet their basic livelihood needs.

## Cambodian National Volleyball League Disabled (CNVLD)



Following a successful program last year, Austcare is again sponsoring a team in the Cambodian National Volleyball League Disabled (CNVLD). This year, Austcare is sponsoring the Anlong Veang Lions. The CNVLD recognises the unique ability and power of team sports programs to assist the physical, physiological and socio-economic wellbeing, of Cambodians with a disability and the landmine survivors of Cambodia, with a positive impact within the following key developmental areas including: health and physical rehabilitation (through sport) of landmine survivors and the people with a disability, raising ongoing awareness of disability issues; and supporting employment creation.

## Samraong School Infrastructure Construction project

Austcare is providing assistance to Svay Chek Commune to re-establish and rehabilitate the Samraong primary school. Working with the Commune Councils and a Commune Development Worker (CDW), Austcare is supporting the purchase of equipment, timber and supplies for the Samraong primary school. Volunteer villagers are providing labour and the school is being re-furnished with desks and chairs so that all children can regularly attend class and complete work. The work is being carried out by the villagers and supplies are purchased locally.

## Support to Rehabilitation of Mine/UXO Victims (SRoMUV)

Austcare is working in eight villages in the Anlong Veng and Trapeang Prasath District of which Austcare already has a strong presence. The project is providing sustainable impacts to disabled people in landmine affected households and communities by increasing their skills. This will help decrease their dependency on collecting food in landmine contaminated fields, selling labour in Thailand or begging. The project is also providing access to rehabilitation, medical and psychological services, and support of self-help groups and income generating activities. It also addresses the local authorities' understanding of disability rights. These efforts will improve the socio-economic conditions of mine affected victims of Cambodia and rehabilitate them back into society.

## Reconstruction of Junior High School, Lamkruet, Lhoknga, Banda Aceh



The Department of Education of Aceh has reported that 973 schools were destroyed by the tsunami that devastated the coastal areas of Aceh on 26 December 2004. Education Department leaders have expressed acute interest in building a junior high school in the Darussalam area, which would be a special school to train the junior high school students from the nearby destroyed areas and reduce overcrowding in existing schools. The goal is for this junior high school to become a model school, setting a high standard for others to follow, not just in this province, but in the country of Indonesia.

## SOLOMON ISLANDS

### Mainstreaming Protection in DRR and DRM Programming in the Solomon Islands.

This two year project is to pilot a bottom-up approach for mainstreaming protection into Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) activities. The approach will strengthen the capacity of local Civil Society Organisations (CSOs) to work with communities to better understand underlying vulnerabilities, build community resilience, and put mechanisms in place to mitigate the impact of disasters, especially on the most vulnerable people. By assisting local partners to adapt Austcare's protection-sensitive DRR approach and methods to their own work, Austcare will build local capacity in a creative approach to vulnerability and mitigation analysis and strengthen local capacity to mitigate the effects of disaster by better assessing and understanding underlying vulnerabilities. These activities will complement, and be coordinated with the work undertaken by other agencies, such as the International Committee of Red Cross, to build the capacity of the Solomon Islands Government and services in DRR and disaster response. This project involves four local development CSOs working in DRR or on DRR-related activities in Solomon Islands.

## Mine Risk Education in Schools for Burmese Refugee Children



As a result of civil war in Burma, hundreds of thousands of Burmese have fled into Thailand to seek refuge and escape military attack, involuntary labour and forced relocations. A major part of the Thai-Burma border, and areas within Burma, are contaminated with anti-personnel landmines and unexploded ordnance. This project aims to develop a "Mine Risk Education (MRE) kit" in close collaboration with school networks and teachers in the camps. The project also involves a participatory development of MRE exercise books and their subsequent publishing and distribution. Beneficiaries' involvement is a key to the cultural appropriateness and sustainability of the project. This is the reason that teachers and students will be involved at every stage of the project.

## Enhanced Protection for Burmese Refugee Communities in Thailand



Austcare is addressing the issues of sexual abuse and gender based violence (SGBV) in refugee camps along the Thai-Burma border. This project is addressing the most urgent protection concerns of refugee women and men by raising awareness of the issues of SGBV both with humanitarian actors in collaboration with the CCSDPT agencies, UNHCR Thailand and Thai Authorities, and with the refugee community through refugee women's organisations. The aim of these complementary activities is to have incidents of SGBV addressed, to hold individuals accountable, and to prevent future incidents.

## Legal Empowerment for Burmese Refugee Communities in Thailand

This project will strengthen protection for refugees living in Thailand/Burma border camps through improved rule of law and greater access to justice. This project will result in camp-based justice officials having increased knowledge of Thai law and the ability to apply improved techniques to administer justice effectively and equitably. Camp residents will have an increased awareness of camp rules and regulations, Thai laws and available means for redressing crimes/grievances. Camp-based security personnel will have the means to more thoroughly investigate crimes and collect evidence for prosecution. Finally, the program will result in Thai justice personnel accepting jurisdiction over serious criminal cases and camp justice officials showing an increased willingness to refer serious crimes to the Thai justice system.

### Building Capacity for Community Based Disaster Risk Management in Timor-Leste

Austcare will utilize Community Based Disaster Reduction Management (CBDRM) expertise and training capacity in its Aceh Indonesia office to complement the capacity of its Timor-Leste office. It will build the capacity of Timorese local counterparts at the national and district government level, as well as among sub-district and community representatives and local Civil Society Organisations. In the first phase of the project, Austcare Timor-Leste will support the National Disaster Management Department to host a national Disaster Risk Reduction Conference in Dili, Timor-Leste on March 11-12, 2008. Conference attendees will include around 80 current agents involved in CBDRM initiatives at the district, sub-district, and community level. International Non Government Organisations, local partner Non Government Organisations, and government representatives will have an opportunity to come together to learn and share their experiences.. In the second phase of the project Austcare will design and deliver workshops/training sessions on CBDRM in the Viqueque and Bobonaro districts to be held in April and May respectively. Each workshop will target 100 participants from district, sub-district, village and sub-village levels, Civil Society Organisations, and Community Based Organisations.

## Armed Violence Baseline Assessment

Austcare and the Small Arms Survey are undertaking a comprehensive armed violence baseline assessment in Timor-Leste. Drawing on a combination of effective research methods – including epidemiological surveys, participatory focus groups and retrospective surveillance of intentional injury in selected hospitals and clinics – the assessment will describe the (i) geographic and longitudinal distribution of armed violence; (ii) the flow, stocks and holdings of small arms and light weapons by different actors; (iii) the command and control of the country’s heterogeneous armed groups; (iv) local attitudes toward international and domestic security providers; and will provide concrete recommendations on practical approaches to enhancing civilian protection and human security.

## RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

### A Place to Call Home: Solutions to Protracted Refugee and IDP Situations in the Asia-Pacific

Austcare’s action-research program is addressing challenges of protracted displacement situations by investigating new strategies for responding to protracted displacement in the Asia-Pacific. Based on comparative empirical research in Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Nepal, Sri Lanka and Thailand, *A Place to Call Home* aims to make a practical contribution to conceptual thinking about and policy responses to durable solutions for some of the region’s most complex protracted refugee and IDP situations, with recommendations for programming and policy development. *A Place to Call Home* will map the current characterisations of and responses to protracted refugee and IDP situations, investigate service delivery options, develop agencies’ capacity to better understand and respond to the specific vulnerabilities of refugees and IDPs, and enhance protection and security through the advancement of durable solutions in protracted displacement situations.
